Five Basic Questions To Ask Yourself Before You File A Claim For A Pigford II Settlement

1. Are you black?
2. Did you farm or try to farm between January 1, 1981 and December 31, 1996?
3. Did you apply for a USDA loan during that period?
4. Did you apply to be a late filer prior to June 18, 2008?
5. Your claim was not processed in Pigford I?

If you answer **“YES”** to **“ALL”** of the questions above, you may have claim.
Remember, filing a claim does not guarantee a settlement.

NOTE: If you are filing for an individual (as the heir, administrator, or assign), estate, or an incapacitated person, that person must also meet the above requirements.
